Twinsburg has a Community Church on the Square to which all are invited.

Twinsburg is also the home of Crown Hill, said to be America's most beautiful burial park.

Twinsburg School

Twinsburg School has evolved from seven one room rural schools into a very modern brick building erected at a cost of approximately \$150,000. The Township owns and maintains auto busses for the conveyance of all pupils to the school. At present the High School rates as a High School of the First Grade. The High School is standardized and the Grades will be standardized this year.

The enrollment this year was approximately 244. The High School enrollment next year will be 60 or more which will be an increase over the present years enrollment of about 28 percent. The Board of Education, with the recommendation of the County Office has decided to employ another teacher. The school will then operate practically on a Junior-Senior High school schedule.

At the present time, including the teachers of music the faculty consists of 12 teachers in the High School and Grades.

In athletic activities, oratory and debate, as well as in scholastic tests, Twinsburg has rated well toward the top in Summit County this year.

The school boasts of a Band, an Orchestra, Girl's and Boy's Glee Clubs, and clubs in art, oratory, spelling, dramatics and debate; in athletics it has teams in Football, Track, and Boy's and Girl's Basket Ball.

One Twinsburg pupil won a place on the County Scholarship Team in the State Scholarship Test.

The school also has a student council composed of representatives from each room and high school class in the building. They represent the student body and also assist very materially in the general discipline of the school.

Twinsburg desires to be known as having an up-to-date, progressive school in which the two chief educational values stressed are Achievement and Co-operation.

Samuel Bissell Memorial Library

The Samuel Bissell Memorial Library was founded on February 22, 1910 at a dinner held in the Church. The money for starting the Library was contributed by residents and former residents of Twinsburg.

A small room in the rear of the Post Office was rented for the Library and many of the first books were gifts of the residents of the town.

For about eight years the Library was supported by contributions, a few books being added each year. All the work being done by the trustees and librarian free of charge.

In 1918 the Library was enlarged taking in another room and refitted throughout. At that time, and for a few years afterwards, the trustees of the township contributed a few hundred dollars each year for the support of the Library.

Afterwards the Library was made a School District Library and the expense of operating the same is now paid by taxation.

At the present time there are over 4,000 books in the Library, and during 1929 there were 5,396 books circulated.

The librarian can be found at the Library on Tuesday and Friday afternoons and Monday and Saturday evenings and will be very glad to help with reference questions or to select the book you wish to read.

Every year new equipment is added to the Library and between three and four hundred new books.

Special attention is given to adding to the Library the books which will be useful to the scholars, especially those in the High School.

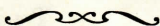
